# LIABILITY INSURANCE

Following an environmental assessment, legal consultation, and discussions with subject matter experts, the Board has approved a revision to the Liability Insurance Policy. These changes required a dietitian to hold:

- an individual professional liability insurance that is separate from their employer's liability insurance
- an occurrence-based or a claims-made professional liability insurance policy that includes an extended reporting period (ERP) of at least two (2) years.
- a professional liability insurance policy that includes legal expense endorsement.

The updated Liability Insurance Policy is located <u>HERE</u>.

This change is scheduled for implementation on April 1, 2025. Prior to their 2025 renewal, dietitians must have insurance that meets the specifications as outlines in the updated Liability Insurance Policy.

# CONTINUING COMPETENCY PROGRAM

An update to the Continuing Competency Program (CCP) has been approved by the Board of Directors. Registrants will submit their CCP in the new format starting with the 2025 renewal. # **CRIMINAL RECORD CHECK WITH VAURNABLE SECTOR**

On April 1, 2024, the College implemented a requirement for a Criminal Record Check with Vulnerable Sector Check as part of the application for registration. **Current registrants will be required to provide a Vulnerable Sector Check every five years, beginning at renewal 2025.** The Check is considered valid if uploaded to your profile within four months of the date on the Check. The College will notify registrants when they are required to provide a new Vulnerable Sector Check. #### **ONLINE REGISTRATION SYSTEM**

The College is transitioning to a new online registration system. As we proceed through the implementation process, registrants can expect to receive relevant information through email in the coming weeks and months. Data will be transferred from our current system on September 4, 2024. Therefore, any information added to the registrant portal following September 3, 2024, will not be saved or transferred. If your address or employment has changed, please update your profile before September 4, 2024 or when the new system is implemented. An email will be sent to inform registrants when the new system is available for registrant login.

#### **CODE OF ETHICS**

The College Board recently approved a new professional Code of Ethics. We would like to thank all dietitians who provided feedback during the consultation period. The Code of Ethics for Dietitians in Nova Scotia is a statement of values, behaviours, and responsibilities that guide interactions and fair decision-making in any professional situation and work environment. The Code of Ethics was developed collaboratively and through partner consultation with six other provincial dietetic regulators. This document is located on the <u>NSCDN</u> website.
